# Competitions

MCLGA competitions are open to all amateur full (including junior and student) members of MCLGA holding a WHS Handicap Index.

Associate members may play **only** in the following competitions:

- Winter Foursomes Hole and Hole
- Greensomes Matches
- Biennial Tri-am
- Biennial 9 Hole competitions

#### Meetings

We run three stroke play meetings per year: Spring, Summer, and Autumn. Each of these has Scratch and Handicap prizes. There are also Aggregate prizes for those who play in all three meetings.

#### **County Championship**

The Spring meeting is the qualifier for both the **Championship** and the **B Championship**. The matchplay is played over two days.

The players who qualify for the **Championship matchplay** will be the 16 players who have indicated on the day of the Spring Meeting that they are available for the Championship matchplay returning the 16 lowest gross scores at the Spring Meeting.

The players who qualify for the **B Championship matchplay** will be the 8 players with a Handicap **Index of 13.0 and above**, who have indicated on the day of the Spring Meeting that they are available for the B Championship matchplay, returning the 8 lowest gross scores at the Spring Meeting.

## **Commonwealth Spoons**

This is a foursomes stroke play competition, open to all County full, student and junior members. The pairings may consist of players from different home clubs but both players must be County members.

This competition is run as a qualifying competition for the Scottish Final organised by Scottish Golf, to compete for the Commonwealth Spoons donated by the Australian Ladies' Golf Union. 10% of the field will qualifying for the Final, the date of which can be found on the Scottish Golf website.

#### Knockouts

We run two knockout competitions per year: the Summer Hole and Hole and Winter Foursomes. The Summer Hole and Hole is a singles competition and has a Silver (Handicap Index of 17.9 and below) and Bronze (Handicap Index of 18.0 and above) Divisions.

#### Biennial 9 Hole and Tri Am

We run a biennial 9 Hole competition and Tri Am. We request a Club Representative from the Committee to organise and run the biennial Tri Am and this has been undertaken successfully for a number of years. We are extremely grateful for all the hard work and effort, that goes into this and for the funds raised for the County.

# Five a-side and Greensomes Leagues

We also run a Five a-side and Greensomes League for members. The Five a-side league has two Divisions with Clubs being promoted and relegated between Divisions at the end of the season. The Greensomes League has two Sections and clubs alternate between the sections to ensure there is variation each season. Further information can be accessed <a href="here">here</a>.

Associate members can only play in the Greensomes League, Full members can play in either or both.

Please contact your Club Representative if you would like to play in the league team for your club. If you are a member of more than one club, you must nominate the club you are going to play for at the start of the season. You can play in Five a-side for one club and Greensomes for another.
